RESOLUTION #2023-24

A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE MAYOR TO RESOLVE PRESENTLY PENDING EEOC COMPLAINTS ON NON-MONETARY TERMS.

WHEREAS, the City receives EEOC complaints on behalf of current or former employees from time to time; and,

WHEREAS, there are occasions when EEOC complaints can be resolved for the benefit of the City without payment to the complainant; and

WHEREAS, when those occasions arise, the Mayor should be authorized to take such action as he deems necessary to resolve the same.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Mayor and Aldermen of the City of La Vergne that, with respect to any and all EEOC complaints pending against the City as of the date of the adoption of this resolution, the Mayor be, and hereby is, authorized to take such action as he deems necessary to resolve those EEOC complaints that can be resolved for the benefit of the City without payment to the complainant.

This resolution will take effect immediately upon its passage, the public welfare requiring it.
